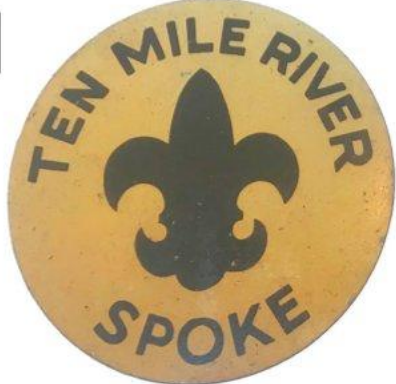


TMR Trail Markers

In 1928, the Brooklyn Scout Camps blazed the White Bar Trail (adapted from the Kanowahkee Lakes White Bar Trail). In the mid-1930s Mort Hyman and Nick Dale initiated the project to blaze a trail that encircled the TMR Camps. The Ten Mile River Trail had red metal markers for the main loop, and yellow markers for the spoke (secondary) trails. Later, plastic blue and yellow markers were introduced for the spoke trails and red plastic markers for the Ten Mile River Trail.
