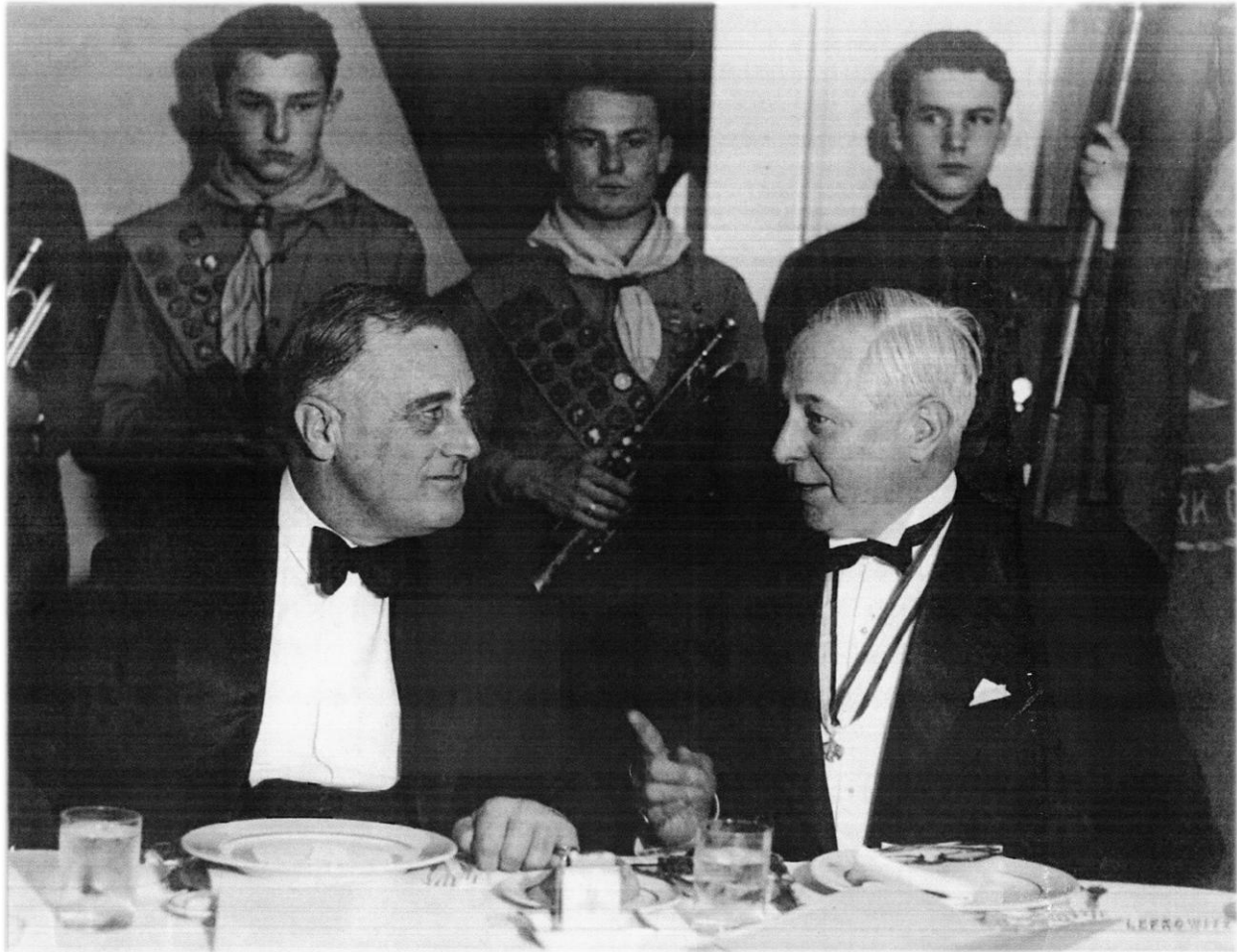


# Boy Scouts of America Centennial Exhibition

Barron Collier, Collier County's founder and namesake, was introduced to the newly founded Scouting movement in New York City in 1910. For the next 25 years he was a tireless promoter and contributor. Collier earned one of the highest honors bestowed by the Boy Scouts of America, the prestigious "Silver Buffalo" award, in 1932, for his active support.

The exhibit will detail Collier's association with prominent political and philanthropic figures of the time as well as his efforts to promote Scouting both in New York and across America.
