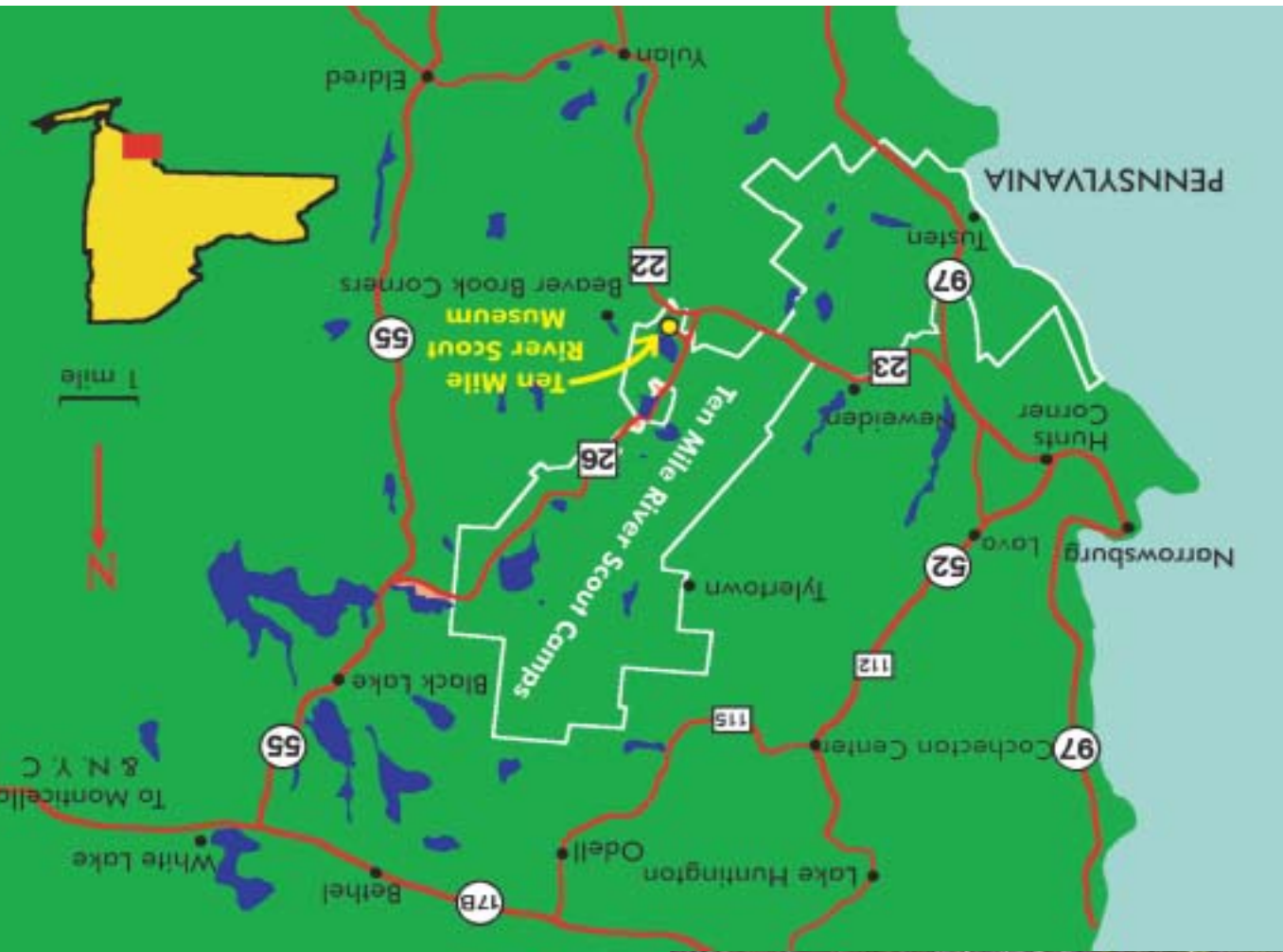

From NYC & Points South:
Travel to and take the upper level of the George Washington Bridge. Take your first exit on your right on the New Jersey side. This will be the Palisades Parkway. Travel north for 35 miles. Bear to your left and take the exit marked Route 6. Travel half-way round the traffic circle and continue on Route 6 for six miles unto Route 17 West. Travel on Route 17 for 44 miles to exit 104 (Monticello Raceway). Travel on 17B for about 6.7 miles into White Lake and blinking light. At 0.7 miles beyond the blinking light make a left hand turn on Route 55 West. Follow Route 55 for about 4 miles to the Ten Mile River Camp cut-off on the right hand side (County Road 26). Follow County Road 26 to the TMR Museum/Headquarters Camp (See signs). Take Exit 121W to 184 West to Exit 1 (Port Jervis). Make left turn at bottom of ramp, through Port Jervis to Route 97. Follow directions from WESTERN NJ/PA & POINTS WEST. **From NJ, near Route I-287:**
Travel north to I-87. Travel on I-87 to the Harriman and

From Western NJ/PA & Points West:
If near either Route 206 or Route 23, travel north to Port Jervis. At Port Jervis, pick up Route 97 going northwest. Travel on Route 97 to County Road 21 (just past Barryville). Take County Road 21 to Yulan and pick up County Road 22 which runs into County Road 23. Travel on County Road 23 to County Road 26 (see large T.M.R. Camp sign on the right). Right turn onto County Road 26 and follow signs to TMR Museum/Headquarters Camp.
From Narrowsburg:
Take Route 97 south to County Road 23. Left turn onto County Road 26 at T.M.R. Camp sign. Follow signs to TMR Museum/Headquarters Camp.



A very extensive collection of memorabilia relating to the Ten Mile River Scout Camps and local history can be viewed at the Ten Mile River Scout Museum, just off County Road 26, near Narrowsburg, N.Y.



The Museum is located at Headquarters Camp, in the heart of the 12,000 acre Ten Mile River Scout Camps. It is open with regular hours each summer during most of July and August. Admission and parking are free. Visits can also be arranged the rest of the year by special request. Picnic area with charcoal stoves are nearby. Fully heated in winter and air conditioned in summer, the Museum offers a variety of souvenirs for interested collectors.

The Library has thousands of documents on the Ten Mile River Scout Camps, the Kanohwahke Scout Camps and New York City Scouting. Individuals interested in doing research at the Library should contact the Archivist at archivist@tmrmuseum.org.
